**LNG Presentation by Save the Bay to be Held on March 24<sup>th</sup>**

A presentation by Save the Bay will take place on March 24<sup>th</sup> at 7pm at the Community Hall. CFPIA residents, as well as any other interested parties may attend. The speaker will be **John Torgan**. John is the official "Bay Keeper" for Save The Bay, where he has worked for over 17 years. The discussion will center on the proposed LNG terminal in Mt Hope Bay by Hess. The presentation will last for approximately 30 to 40 minutes, followed by a question and answer period.

This topic has been hotly debated in both Rhode Island and Massachusetts for several years. Many different agencies as well as politicians have given their positions at multiple meetings and information sessions. We will discuss the position the CFPIA should take at the April 19<sup>th</sup> Community meeting.

Please plan to attend the presentation on March 24<sup>th</sup>. Bring your questions, concerns and interests and let your voice be heard.

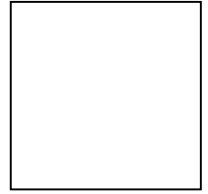
And now to the Trash Can Angel who did stop and emptied the **frozen** trash cans this winter .... XOXOXOXOXO!!!!
